Conditions of Entry

1. An applicant from Canada with a completed degree will be granted credit of 16 units towards completion of the 64 unit LLB. This means the applicant is only required to complete 48 units of study to be awarded the LLB.
2. The 48 units will consist of 24 2-unit courses: four courses per semester for six semesters.
3. Entry to the LLB program is subject to minimum entry requirements and is only possible once per year, at the beginning of semester 1 (March).
